Update on The Oregon Garden

As many of you may have heard, it was reported that The Oregon Garden was having a few financial problems. Rumors began to quickly spread that The Garden was going to close its doors. We wanted to take this opportunity to dispel this rumor and give you an update on how great our Oregon Garden is doing. There have been some exciting changes over the last couple years as well as some fun events. You are invited to stop in for a visit to experience first hand how lucky we are to have The Oregon Garden in our hometown.

This summer will bring the completion of two new specialty gardens, the Sensory Garden and the Lewis & Clark Garden. The completed Sensory Garden will feature plants with remarkable scents and textures as well as a water feature called a "Rain Curtain". The Lewis & Clark Garden will feature plants that were identified on the great journey of Lewis & Clark as well as a beautiful water feature. This garden will be an interactive experience that will educate visitors about their journey.

This past April The Oregon Garden hosted its 7th Annual Auction and Gala. Lots of work and planning went into this hugely successful event. Jan Grimes (Silverton High graduate, class of '72) worked with a team of board members, volunteers and event planners for months ahead to ensure another memorable occasion. The theme for the night was "Water". As

many of you may know, the city of Silverton had an enormous amount of excess wastewater before The Garden arrived. This brought about the arrangement between the city and The Oregon Garden that secured The Garden's location in Silverton. The city allowed The Garden to be built in Silverton and in return The Garden takes the excess treated wastewater. The treated wastewater is pumped up to

2005 Honorary Diplomas Awarded Fred and Nola Parkinson

Fred and Nola Parkinson attended Idaho State University. Fred graduated with a B.S. in Pharmacy. They lived in southern Oregon for a few years and then moved to Silverton and bought Silverton Drug in 1955. They owned and operated the store until 1994.

During the past 50 years they lived in Silverton, Fred served on school and city budget committees, was President of Rotary, a member of the City Council, Mayor of Silverton for two terms and then served six terms as a State Representative in the Oregon Legislature (1981 - 1993).

Nola was on a school board, active in Jr. Women and served on the Silverton Hospital Foundation.

They had five children who attended Silverton schools during five decades from 1956 through 1993. Their family legacy continues today with their grandchildren enrolled in the Silver Falls School District. All of their five children were members of Choralaires. Fred and Nola spent wonderful times following them to contests and performances. They have watched

and supported the school as their children and grandchildren play tennis, volleyball, baseball, soccer, basketball, football and cheerleading.

They were proud to receive the Silverton Chamber Lifetime Achievement award in 2000.

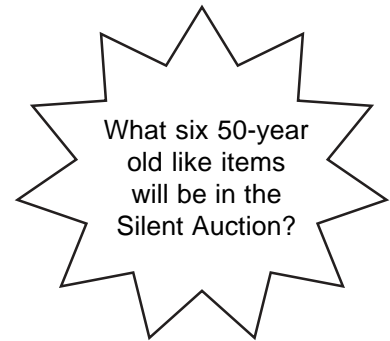

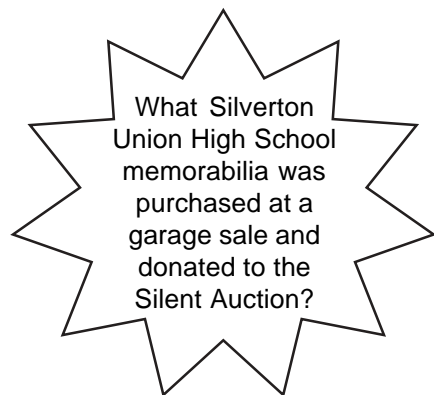

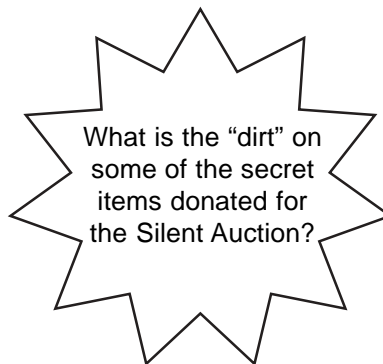

8. In the morning between 9:00 and 10:00 a.m. on the day of the event, someone from your class must be present to reserve tables at ten people per table. If you purchase 22 tickets you are then permitted to reserve two tables on a first come first reserved basis. You might want to make some kind of table decoration to say, "Reserved for the Class of ____". Note that NO "lighter than air balloons" are allowed in the pavilion. Also, no signs can be attached to the walls of the pavilion.

9. On Friday night, someone from your class should be at the admission door and available to hand out the tickets to your classmates. Some classes make special identity tags for their classmates. Anyone who shows up and needs to purchase a ticket is welcome; however, tickets bought *on the day of the event* cost an additional \$5.00. Tickets are available at the door.

10. The bars are pay as you go for beer, wine and liquor. We will normally have soft drinks available at no cost.

11. The cafeteria style meal is included in your admission fee and normally provided by the Wooden Nickel.

You can see that together we can help you have a great time at the Alumni & Friends Garden Party. One of the joys of the gathering is that you will see more people than you can possibly find the time to talk to. We have had members from classes back in 1928 and most recent as is legally allowed - *you must be 21 to attend.*

Check your calendars and join us for a wonderful traditional event that is in its seventh year. Your attendance will also assist us in raising scholarship money for the next graduating class from ol' Silverton High. To date we have given out over \$20,000 in tuition assistance to SHS grads. So, join us at the Oregon Garden Pavilion on the first Friday in August and have fun raising funds.

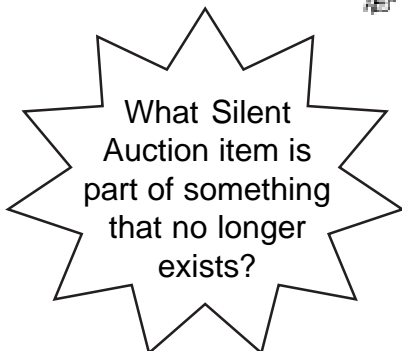
