History of SHS

I thought researching the history of Silverton High School would be a simple matter of putting dates on the pictures. Craig Roessler, SHS current School District Superintendent, allowed me to read a book by Minnie Engeman. She did a fantastic job of documenting all the buildings. The pictures on pages 8 and 9 are from copies on paper, so the reproduction is not the quality I would have liked. But in order to tell the history of the high school, I felt the grade schools had to be included.

The first Silverton public school was a 2-room, 2-story building started in 1862. There were 96 school age children in the district. About 1889 the pupils overflowed the schoolhouse. The building was sold in 1890 and moved to the corner of Park and First Streets, where the building remained until the land was needed for a high school building in 1907.

The 2-story building is still standing, located at High and 3rd Streets, and known as the MWA Hall. Many square dances were held there in the late 40's and early 50's. The building is owned by the Modern Woodworkers Association.

In 1890 a six room school building was completed for fall term. The building was named Emerson by the P.T.A. when they named other school buildings in 1922.

In 1907, a six room high school, later named Washington Irving, was erected. 1913-1914 school year the enrollment was 89 for the high school.

According to Minnie Engeman's book, "History of Silverton Public Schools" (new edition 1996), Eugene Field was built affronting North Water Street. Eugene Field School was ready for use in May 1922 according to the historical booklets we have in the district office. The first phase consisted of eight classrooms, the gym, library, office, etc. In August of 1921, Emerson School was moved to the corner of First and A Street to make room for the construction of Eugene Field School. Emerson School burned to the ground during Christmas vacation in 1924.

In 1915 the new high school was erected on First Street between

Park and A Streets, next to the Washington Irving Building. This was known to many as the "new high school".

In 1916 the school system had an enrollment of 642 students, 145 of which were in the high school.

The high school on Schlador Street was built in 1939 for grades 9 through 12. 7th and 8th grades were in the 1915 building, with grades kindergarten through 6th grade in Eugene Field.

In 1955 Mark Twain replaced the old Junior High (1915 building). Robert Frost school was built in 1971 for grades four to six. For the school year of 2006-07, Eugene Field holds grades Kindergarten through third grades, Robert Frost fourth through sixth grades, Mark Twain seventh through eighth grades, the Pine Street Campus for 9th grade freshmen, and Silverton High School grades 10 through 12.

The Washington Irving building and the 1915 building were torn down and the First Christian Church occupies that ground today.

In summary, the Washington Irving Building was the first high school. The second one was the 1915 building, which later became the "Junior High" when the Schlador Street high school was built.

Who named the schools? Why authors? One theory is that the book "Winkin, Blinkin & Nod" was quite popular when the grade school was built. Eugene Field was the author, so the P.T.A. named the school. Note that all grade schools are named for authors; the high school remains unnamed.

BBQ PORK RIBS

Recipe by Mrs. Duane Beard
 Sear ribs on high heat or BBQ both sides to burn off fat (keep lid on BBQ). Generously brush Bull's Eye BBQ sauce on both sides of ribs and place in roaster (with lid). Bake at 375° for 45 minutes, then 350° for 1/2 hour to 45 minutes. Then 250° for 1 hour. Do not remove lid until ready to serve.

Honorary Diplomas for 2007

Honorary diplomas were presented to Robert Dedrick and Jerry Coon at the SHS graduation ceremony on June 7, 2007.

Robert Dedrick

Robert Dedrick came to Silverton Union High School in the fall of 1969 and spent the next 36 years at Silverton teaching every math class offered, coaching track and field and tennis, announcing for the football and wrestling teams and spending countless hours involved in the lives of SHS students.

Twice he was elected by his peers as president of the local teacher's association, was appointed to the State Department of Education standards committee, spent summers as an appointee to the National Science Foundation workshops, directed the outreach program at Chemeketa Community College and was involved at the founding of the local school site council program.

During his first year at Silverton High School Robert taught physics to current astronaut Dr. Don Pettit and during his final year teaching he came full circle, coordinating a video conference between the International Space Station and Silverton students, giving them a chance to ask Dr. Pettit questions while he orbited the earth.

In addition to all his school activities, he has been active in his community, and has been twice selected as Silverton Together Volunteer of the Year at the Silverton Area Chamber of Commerce First Citizen banquet.

Gerald "Jerry" Coon

After graduating from South Salem High, Jerry spent the next 10 years completing his military duties, graduating from Oregon College of Education (Western Oregon University) and working at MacLaren School.

He started teaching and coaching at Silverton High in 1971. His ability to relate with both the students and athletes was one of his excellent strengths. Jerry coached the JV Basketball team during the 1970's and the Varsity boy's teams from 1980 to 1985. The 1984 team competing in the Oregon State Playoffs was one of his most memorable years.

He also coached freshman and JV Baseball as well as Varsity Golf.

Jerry also spent many hours during the summers coaching basketball and junior golf.

After retiring in 1992, Jerry taught part-time at SHS and continues to this day being the scorekeeper for the football and basketball games as the students at Silverton High remain very important to him.



WASHINGTON IRVING -
also known as the **FIRST HIGH SCHOOL - 1907 - 1915**

In 1907, a six room high school was built at First and Park Streets. In 1922 it was named Washington Irving. The building had a basement of stone and walls of brick cemented outside. It was first used as a high school from 1907 to 1915 and from 1915 to 1928 as upper elementary and from 1928 to 1939 as a junior high school.

E.E. Washburn was the superintendent and Mattie Kentner was principal of the new high school.

In 1913-1914, the high school enrollment was 89 students.

The current grade school Eugene Field now stands on this corner. (Photo credit to Silverton Country Historical Museum)

The 1915 High School was built of tile with brick facings, with both white and red pressed brick used for finishing the front. The three story building measured 91 feet x 72 feet and cost the district \$14,000. The tenth through twelfth graders enjoyed a first floor which held a domestic science room, manual training area, cloak rooms, and restrooms. The second floor contained the superintendents's office, teachers' room, and six classrooms. The third floor consisted of a main assembly room that seated 110 with a stage at one end, a library, large science laboratory, sewing room, and commercial classroom.



Later the school housed seventh and eighth graders. Unfortunately, by 1955 the school was condemned and by 1961 the structure was torn down along with Washington Irving School to make room for the new First Christian Church. (Photo credit to Silverton Country Historical Museum)



In 1939 the new high school on Schlador Street opened and the junior high school was held in the 1915 building. Washington Irving was no longer used except for selected classes during the next few years. In 1939, the school was traded to the City of Silverton for the athletic field for the new high school at the end of Brown Street. (Photo credit to Raggie Clites)

When I was five, I entered Eugene Field School as a kindergarten. Miss Montgomery was my teacher. Kindergarten was held half days - morning or afternoon sessions. I believe mine was the morning session. (I've always been a morning person)

The next year was first grade with Miss Olga Johnson, second grade Hannah Olson. First through sixth grades each had three teachers. Kindergarten started at the southeast corner at First and Park streets, moving along the length of the building to sixth grade at the northwest corner of Water and A Streets.

Seventh and eighth grades were in the 1915 building across First Street. When I was attending, it was the "Junior High" building. My mother told me it was the High School when she attended. It was changed to the "Junior High" when the "new" high school was built on Schlador Street.

In 1955 the 1915 building was condemned and Mark Twain was built. The seventh and eighth graders from the 1915 building moved to Mark Twain. Mark Twain then held the sixth, seventh and eighth grades.

I remember attending "Bible study" in the Washington Irving building. There was an old Victrola where the needle was housed in a the huge round piece that folded back over the arm. You had to be careful not to drop it onto the record (and tall enough to reach it). Records were very popular when I was growing up. The speeds were 78, 45 and 33 1/3.

What's your memory? Can you name all your teachers? How many of your kindergarten class gradu-

ated with you at SHS or SUHS High School? Are you still in touch with those classmates?

These newsletters are sent bulk mail to keep postage costs to a minimum. If one is returned as undeliverable, it costs us an additional 70¢. Most of those returned as postage due are because you have “moved, left no address” or marked “forwarding time expired” or “Undeliverable as addressed - unable to forward”.

What is a Class Rep?
