Cousin Spotlight: Family of John Thomas Utley

John Thomas Utley was the fifth child and third son born to **John** and **Edrie Utley**. **John** was born on September 4, 1933 in Lavinia, Carroll County, TN. He married **Mary Magdalene Pipkin** on December 21, 1953 in Corinth, Alcorn County, MS. **John** and **Mary** had two daughters, **Deborah Ann** and **Cynthia Claire**. **Cynthia** died on May 25, 1985 in a car accident.

Deborah Ann Utley Mayo

In response to a questionnaire, Debbie wrote:

“My full name is **Debora Ann Utley Mayo**. I am called **Debbie**. I was born on March 24, 1955 at 11:15 a.m. in Madigan Army Hospital in Tacoma, Washington. I was born when Dad was in the Army, in Washington state. Almost all of my dad’s buddies came to the hospital when I was born.

An early memory is going to eat at **Nanny & Pa’s [Edrie & John Utley]** on Wed. night. We got to see our cousins—**Pat & Pam** then. **Pat** & I used to run away from everyone else so we could play.

Memories of celebrating Christmas: Getting up early with my sister & playing with our toys from Santa. Then we would go back to bed until we heard our parents get up. We always had to act surprised for them.

Early school memory: Going to Highland Park Elementary [Jackson, TN] & fighting for the center spot on the merry go round.

Family vacations I remember: Going to the river & leaning to swim. I was pushed off a rock & started to swim cos I thought I was going to die! Going camping at Land Between the Lakes. **Cindy** & I both got to bring a friend along. We had so much fun & drove my parents crazy.

My first paying job was summer sales at the Bandbox in the [Old Hickory] Mall. I always got first pick of the formals for school dances.

My longest employment as an adult was working with my friend Amanda, doing embroidery work on her 4 head machine. We had lots of laughs & lots of hard work.

My education consisted of Highland Park Elementary, 1st –6th, Tigrett Jr. High, 7th-9th, Jackson Central Merry, 10th-12th. My favorite subject in school was spelling & writing, and my least favorite was any kind of math.

Special memories of my **Utley** grandparents: **Nanny** used to cook chittlings. It was the most awful smell. We all ate outside but the guys. Also I have a special memory of me & **Cindy, Pam, Pat, & Mark & Alan**. We crossed a ditch to have a picnic after walking where we weren’t supposed to go on **Pa’s** land. We had a picnic in the middle of a soybean field. We wondered what that foul smell was? We didn’t find out until later that they were rotted in the field. We had our picnic tho.

My children are **Misty Shay Roe**, born June 6, 1975 in Jackson Madison County General Hospital; and **John Logan Mayo**, born April 12, 1989 in Jackson Madison County General Hospital.

My grandchild is **Brilee Jade Mayo**, born on June 7, 2007 at Jackson Madison County General Hospital. Another grandchild is on the way, to be born in April of 2010. Both are children of my son, **Logan** & his wife, **Jessica**.

I am a member of Malesus Baptist Church; worked with Cub Scouts and was Den Leader for lots of years; and moved on with my Den to Boy Scouts.

If my home caught on fire, and I could go back to retrieve only one thing (assuming all people and pets were safely out), I would choose pictures—especially the

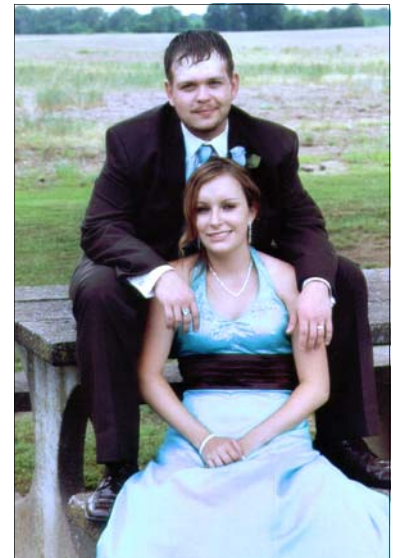

He is survived by his son, **Gary Usinger**; and his grandson, **Travis Usinger**.

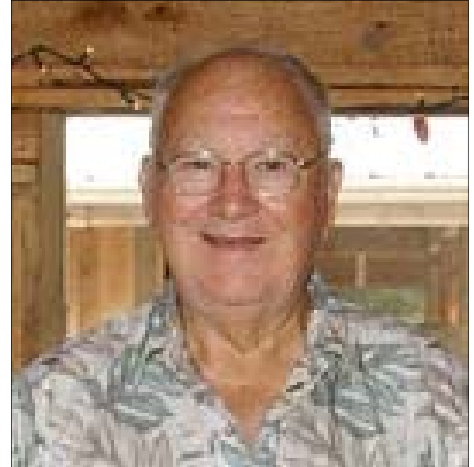

Held in the interest of reducing inmate returns to incarceration, the State of TN invested the time and energy to bring emphasis within the corrections system by providing training in the "ripple effect" of crime on families of both the victim and perpetrator. This was done during the course of a group of classes which involved studies and exercises which were

accented by the testimonies of several victims of major case crimes from various locations across the country.

The Victim-Speakers included those who had experienced personal assault, murder of family members, rape and robbery as singular or combination events.

The speakers provided more than a simple description of their experiences. The events were presented in the context of a stop-motion play with descriptions of what was experienced at that moment and how each event has impacted their lives since the occurrence.

Speaking as a spectator, the deliveries were given in such a manner that the listeners, as closely as possible, literally experienced the events which were being described.

After the presentations we participants were required to teach various aspects of training concerning inmate interactions involving employees of the Board Of Parole and Pre-Release Counselors such as myself.

At the conclusion of the week it became clear that those who have been involved with such crimes, whether victim or perpetrator, impacts all of society; i.e., the ripple effect. Or, as one

speaker more succinctly put it, "The poor choices of a few impact the many."

For me personally, it was a mind and life altering experience which I will take with me always in both professional and personal interactions."
