BLINDSIDED BY PA. LAW, 101-YEAR-OLD MANAGES TO CAST ABSENTEE BALLOT IN-PERSON

Bernice Chilton is a member of the Ransom-Sease family, residing in York, PA. This story by Jasmine Vaughn-Hall was printed in the York Daily Record on October 30, 2020.

Bernice Chilton has never missed her chance to vote — and she wasn't about to stop now. Grasping her walker, the 101-year-old stood at the bottom of a flight of white stone

steps at the old courthouse Tuesday. Chilton would make that trek. Even if she ached.

She's developed arthritis, which makes her legs and hands sore. She fractured her arm in a fall a few weeks ago. Nonetheless, she didn't intend to let that keep her from voting. For her sake, though, her caretaker and granddaughter, Ceita Walker, had opted to get Chilton an absentee ballot for the 2020 election. They usually vote together at a center near their home.

Walker took the ballots with her to work because she planned to put them in York County's only drop box at the old courthouse downtown. This is the first year that Pennsylvania has allowed <u>early</u>

<u>voting.</u> Walker was a little nervous about leaving the ballots in her car, fearing someone might try to break in if they saw them. After work, she headed to the drop box and put her ballot in.

Before she could add her grandmother's ballot, someone stopped her. Walker was told that Chilton would have to be present for her to cast her vote — even though her grandmother could hardly walk. <u>According to</u> <u>Pennsylvania law</u>, "voters must return their own ballots. The only exceptions to this are for voters with a disability who have designated someone in writing to deliver their ballot." Fearful over reports of ballots being pulled out of the mail and dumped elsewhere, Walker didn't want to chance it. She was going to get her grandmother.

"I really wanted to vote," Chilton said. "Never have [I] missed voting."

In short order, Chilton stood with her granddaughter in the face of the only thing standing between her and her vote: a flight of stairs. Walker didn't see a ramp when they approached the building.

It didn't matter.

"If she couldn't make it up, I would have asked somebody to help me," Walker said. "She could have got on my back. I didn't care. She was gonna cast her ballot because that's what she wanted to do."

Chilton was exhausted afterward, but she made it up those steps.

Her granddaughter took a picture of Chilton displaying her "I Voted" sticker on the right side of her off-white jacket and shared it on social media, telling people they have "no excuse" for not getting out to vote.

A CENTURY OF STANDING HER GROUND

Chilton has stood her ground for as long as she can remember.

As a preteen in York, she heard a student call the only other Black person in the room the n-word. So she smacked the name-caller.

"I was never treated like some people say they were. I wouldn't let them do it," Chilton said, a mindset she said allowed her to evade direct discrimination and harassment because of her race.

She's always voted — though the specifics of that first election are a bit hazy. She does, however, know who her favorite president is. The deep thought sends her right hand under her chin as she leans back into her plushy red sofa chair in the living room.

Was it Clinton? No, no. It was Kennedy. Her realization is quickly followed by a schoolgirl giggle. "To me, [he] was a good president for Black people," she said.

Walker thinks Chilton is an inspiration for staying committed to voting in a country that didn't always allow her to. The centenarian humbly refuses the praise, reassuring that she is who she is with or without the approval of others. And before reverting to a conversation where she's less of the focus, she leans forward and offers a final thought.

"FAMILY MATTERS"

This was the theme for our family reunion. This statement is of a great truth. Family matters to God and He has placed this great truth into the hearts of those who seek Him, who honor Him, and who desire to walk in His way.

In His Word, the book of Chronicles records the genealogies which trace back to Adam. These records

served to remind those returning and entering into the family about the promises (land) and duties and blessings connected to tribal ancestry.

Psalm 68:6 says God setteth the solitary in families: He brings out those which are bound with chains: but the rebellious dwell in a dry land. *Solitary* in this case can mean

"an anchoret"- someone (a family) who for religious reasons withdraws from secular society (the norm) so as to be able to lead a prayer oriented or spiritually focused life (the way God desires).
